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The HHSRS is a system for assessing housing conditions, given statutory effect by Part 1 of the Housing Act 2004. It replaced the previous test of fitness for human habitation in section 604 Housing Act 1985. Under the HHSRS a local authority: carries out inspections of rented housing; identifies whether any specified hazards are present
